

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS REGARDING SYNOD SCHOOL

What should I bring?

See packing list that is attached.

What can I expect on the first day?

When you register you will receive a packet that includes your room and keys, your class assignments and room locations, and a Program Book that describes each day's schedule and opportunities. After dinner, the community gathers for worship and a time of welcome and orientation to the week. There will be an opportunity to find the classrooms of the children and youth and meet their teachers as well.

What kind of free time do we have?

There is a built in 2.5 hour break between the morning classes and afternoon classes that allows for lunch, naps, shopping, partaking in ArtShare or a mission project, swimming, reading, resting and more. After worship the evenings have optional events but can be free if you choose.

Are there opportunities for recreation?

Tennis and volleyball courts are available and golf courses are nearby, but you must bring your own equipment. There is a walking trail along the lake south of campus, but there is no beach for swimming nearby. Please don't bring skateboards, roller skates, in-line skates and any other recreational equipment that would compete with pedestrians or wheelchairs for sidewalk space. Golfing is available through Synod School on Wednesday.

What if people need to contact me during the week?

There are phones in the lounges of all the dorms, but not in your dorm room. We encourage you to bring your cell phone if you need to have a phone in your room. When you cannot be reached at your dorm, the following numbers will be helpful:

Is smoking permitted on campus?

Consistent with Iowa law, the whole campus (including dorms, classroom buildings, lawns, etc.) are non-smoking areas. If you must smoke, you'll need to do it "in the street;" please dispose of cigarette butts appropriately.

How much money do I need to bring?

Meals are included in the registration fees for those staying on-campus. Commuters may purchase meals they wish to eat. Coffee and ice water will be available for everyone in the Social Science and Arts Hall during breaks. Vending machines are available to purchase soft drinks and snacks. If you plan to purchase books or gifts, credit cards are accepted by the Synod School and campus bookstores. For other purchases bring either cash or checks. We will receive an offering for scholarships on Wednesday and we hope you will give generously to help others attend next year.

Will I be able to do laundry during the School?

There are laundromats on campus which are free, but you must bring your own detergent.

What about accessing my email?

Computers are available in the campus library in Siebens Forum. Wireless internet access is also available throughout campus. *Not all cell services have good coverage in the Forum.*

Can I bring videos or DVDs for me or my kids to watch during free time?

You may, but be aware that there is no public equipment for viewing them. If you do bring a DVD to share, we ask that it be previewed by the committee or staff before it is used on campus. (This is policy.)

Suggested packing list

Clothes

- Casual clothes
- Sweater, sweatshirt or jacket for air conditioned rooms
- Robe or something appropriate to get to the bathroom if you will be in the dorms

- Sheets (extra-long twin)
- Blankets
- Pillows
- Towels and wash cloth

Other:

- Soap
- Bible
- Notebook & writing implement
- Athletic equipment (but no skateboards, skates, etc.) as desired
- Extension cord
- Laundry detergent if you think you'll need it.
- Hangers
- Alarm clock
- Reading light
- Snacks if you need them between meals
- Items required for your classes (if needed...)
- Charger for phone
- Personal effects (hair dryer, shampoo, etc.)
